Subject: Capital Outlay Funding Recommendations for Higher Education

Dear Secretary Romero:

The New Mexico Higher Education Department (NMHED) is pleased to present the Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24) Capital Outlay Funding Recommendation for Higher Education. This recommendation provides funding to support new construction, renovation, infrastructure improvements, and demolition at higher education institutions statewide. Our recommendation also considers funding to address increases in material and labor costs experienced by higher education institutions over the past couple of years. These increases have resulted in projects being under-funded, jeopardizing the ability to expend existing appropriations and to complete projects.

The NMHED Capital Outlay Committee, chaired by Dr. Gerald Burke and comprised of representatives from the NMHED, Department of Finance and Administration, Energy Minerals and Natural Resources Department, and Legislative Finance Committee, utilize the NMHED's planning and funding criteria and metrics to review and prioritize projects for recommendation. During this year's NMHED Capital Outlay Committee Hearings, the committee traveled to different locations in the state to hear presentations by the higher education institutions. During these hearings, colleges and universities presented 78 capital projects totaling \$366,075,506 in capital needs statewide. The total amount of funding requested was \$222,355,700.

After the hearings, each of the requests was reviewed and scored by each committee member using the agency's Capital Funding Request and Management System (CFRMS). The CFRMS system ranked the projects based on the committee scores for each metric. The NMHED then prioritized the projects based on other factors and data provided by the higher education institution including how the project affected the school's deferred maintenance, future operational and maintenance, and utility and energy impact.

The NMHED recommendation is broken up into separate project types as listed Exhibit A. Of the 78 projects presented, 42 are being recommended for funding totaling \$81,801,497. In the recommendation, \$55,620,492 is for projects that were prioritized by the higher education institutions for funding during the upcoming legislative session. Each of these projects is being recommended at a funding amount that

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will allow the institution to complete the project or a functional phase. Another \$25,181,005 is recommended to address projects which are now under-funded due to the increase in construction, material, and labor costs. This funding will allow higher education institutions to complete the project originally requested and approved. More details on the specific projects and cost can be found in Exhibit A.

The NMHED continues to remain committed to the removal of buildings on campuses across the state that are no longer in use or have exceeded their useful life. This initiative supports the agency's long-standing requirement that prohibits the expansion of square footage without an equal off set of space. During last year's legislative session, the agency was able to secure \$3,500,000 for demolition. This funding was allocated to the higher education institutions that provided a five-year demolition plan to the agency. This year's request supports the projects that are on the five-year demolition plan for colleges and universities. This funding is key in reducing liability on campuses as well as reducing the deferred maintenance and operational costs associated with their continued upkeep. The NMHED recommendation supports the demolition of 46 facilities at a cost of \$18,058,795. More details on the specific projects and associated cost can be found in Exhibit B.
